

User testing

Following feedback from children, young peole, parnets, carers and professionals about the accessibility and navigation of the website the website was reviewed and a new website developed.

The new website was developed based on feedback over the last four years. The new webiste was launched 1 April 2024, the Leeds Parent Carer Forum and Leeds SEND Youth Council user tested the new website and provided feedback.





Feedback from the Leeds SEND Youth Council



Accessibility and navigation

- It was easy to navigate and broken down nicely into categories.
- Easy to find what you are looking for.
- It is clearly set out and easy to navigate.
- I felt like everything was really accessible and easy to find my way around.
- The website is very clearly set out in ways that numerous people of different abilities could access.
- Movement around the website is easy. It easy to find information.
- Black text on the white background causes visual stress.
- Main body of texts are not easy to read. Alternative font would be appropriate, and/or a coloured website background
- Easy to navigate and get a gain a general understanding without having to read lots of documents.
- It's a bit too colourful and gives headaches.
- The look in general of vibrant colours on tabs and back ground it feels very bright instead of some websites that are just playing black and white.
- The website had a good clear range of places which where clearly labelled into delegate category's to make it less confusing.
- Some font can appear quite small.

Content

- It was very detailed, and I found the information easy to understand.
- The website didn't always have a website to the areas just a social media which people who don't have social won't be able to access.
- Information isn't right for all the schools.
- Easy to find tabs for people who may struggle to see and understand small and hard writing.
- The website at times felt quite wordy which some people might struggle with.

General feedback

- The website feels very welcoming.
- It is great!
- Some of the information can feel a little patronising.
- The layout is nice to look at. It feels clean and professional, without being boring or overwhelming.
- In general it's good it definitely is accessible to all people
- The website was brightly coloured and felt like it was inclusive of everyone.

Accessibility and navigation

- Simple and easy to navigate.
- The links are very clear in the green tiles and how you access other tiles within that topic.
- I like the large clear tiles and the pictures used to give a clear summary of what each category is.
- The box to translate to alternative languages was clear once found but do wonder if this should be at the top as if the page came up in a different language I am not sure I would go to the bottom to see if I could change it.
- There is quite a lot of writing on some pages which can be of putting.
- The black writing on the white background is less clear than the tiles.
- I found the search box useful, the splitting of categories is good.
- Layout is great.
- Links are clear and distinctive.
- Like the use of videos.
- Search navigation easy to use.

Content

- Very informative.
- Like the fact there are lots of links to take you to additional websites or information within the writing. These are highlighted so easily seen.
- Some of the links like to the short breaks catalogue was good but then found the information hard to follow and had acronyms without the full meaning. Also important information was missing like ratios on some activities.
- Acronyms seem to be covered on the Leeds SEND local offer but when you follow some of the links they are still used without an explanation.

General feedback

- Google search is good, searched for Leeds Local Offer and it was top.
- Personal budgets include in finance section.
- EHCPs include on main education page.
- It would be useful if the Alternative provision section included a link to some of the different APs and AIPs within Leeds so parents know their options.
- It isn't clear on the Early Help page who can access the support.
- Short breaks statement include in things to do section.
- Clusters not showing as alphabetic. It'll be easier to find if they were.
