The Leeds Local Offer provides information for children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) and their families in a single place.


It shows families what they can expect from a range of local agencies including education, health and social care.



Children's Speech and Language Therapy, Leeds Community Healthcare NHS Trust

Speech and language therapy helps children and young people improve their talking and communication skills. It involves assessing and providing support for issues with speaking, understanding, and using language. Therapists suggest activities and strategies to support better speech, language, and social interaction.

Your child or young person may have difficulties with swallowing, eating and drinking (dysphagia) and a Speech and Language Therapist can support with this too.

We accept referrals from healthcare and education. We make onward referrals to other services as needed.

ICAN (Integrated Children with Additional Needs)

We help children and young people who have additional needs due to developmental delay or disorder by:

- Supporting the participation and inclusion of children, young people with disabilities and their families in everyday activities.
- Empowering children, young people and their families to self-manage conditions and feel in control of their care.
- Identifying and managing underlying impairments such as disabilities and illnesses to prevent or reduce secondary conditions.
- Promoting child wellbeing through safeguarding and healthy lifestyle support.

We do this by working with children and families to find out what goals they most want to achieve. We help to identify any underlying problems and give children and families the information they need to make choices about their care. We work with children, families and other people (such as other health workers, teachers and community workers) to identify the best way for children and young people to achieve their goals. This may involve direct intervention for the child, but may also include support and training for other people or changes to their environment or activities.

We are a local charity that provides weekend and evening social clubs for children and young people with disabilities and additional needs. We have been doing this for over twenty years! All of our projects help young people to have fun, make new friends, try new activities and grow in confidence in a safe, supportive and welcoming space.

Weekenders Club is a play scheme providing a short break for children and young people with additional needs aged 5-18 in the Leeds area.

Weekenders Club is open 47 Saturdays a year. From 1st June 2024 we will operate from The Vinery Centre, 20 Vinery Terrace, East End Park, Leeds, LS9 9LU.

Children and young people who attend Weekenders Club can access the club once every four weeks. Our $\frac{1}{2}$ -day sessions are 9.30 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. or 1.30 p.m. to 4.30 pm. When a child is allocated a group, this group stays the same for each visit.

Our staffing level is one staff member/volunteer to one child/young person. All of our staff are experienced and well trained and work alongside dedicated volunteers to enhance the service we provide.

Out & About Project - We organise around three events per month for the teens that attend Out and About Project. This is anything from bowling, cinema, eating out, snooker, trampolining, LaserZone, theatre, circus trips, theme park visits (in the school holidays) and local attractions such as Yorkshire Wildlife Park and Stockeld Park... basically anything teens would like to do!

We have trained and experienced staff who already work for us at the Weekenders Club and we staff each trip according to the level of support required. Please note we do not offer one-to-one supervision for this service.

Child Health and Disability Team

The Child Health and Disability Service, often known as CHAD, is made up of a number of teams working with children and young people aged 0-18 with complex health needs and disabilities, where their disability has an impact on their ability to be safe, develop skills for life and be part of their local communities growing up.

The service, which sits with Children and Families Services in the local authority, aims to ensure that every child in Leeds with a complex health need and disability benefits from child-centred, high-quality, flexible and responsive services to help them live a successful and fulfilling life.

Auditory Verbal UK

Auditory Verbal UK (AVUK) supports deaf babies and children to learn to listen and speak with Auditory Verbal therapy. Auditory Verbal therapy is a family-centred specialist approach to developing spoken language through listening for deaf children. It supports pre-school deaf children, from birth to five years of age, learn how to make sense of the sound they receive through their hearing technology, like cochlear implants and hearing aids, and develop spoken language so they can learn to talk like their hearing friends.

AVUK's Auditory Verbal therapy family programme includes fortnightly therapy sessions. All therapy sessions are delivered by a highly specialist certified Auditory Verbal Therapist, who is a teacher of the deaf, speech and language therapist or audiologist who has undergone a minimum of three years additional post-graduate internationally accredited training.

As a charity, AVUK is able to offer sessions both in person at its location in north-east Leeds, online or using a hybrid approach of both depending on the needs and preferences of each family. We currently have bursaries for families living in Leeds and beyond to help access our programme.

Through personal experience we recognise the importance of allowing the parents and families of a child with an additional need or disability the opportunity to meet people in similar situations, to make friends and support each other.

We know that to every family that this is an individual journey but we also recognise the importance of sharing the events of that journey with other people in similar situations. We offer a range of support from our Outreach Programme for those families that are just not quite ready to come to one of our sessions. But for those that are, we offer a variety of support from Stay n Play to monthly Family Fun Days.
