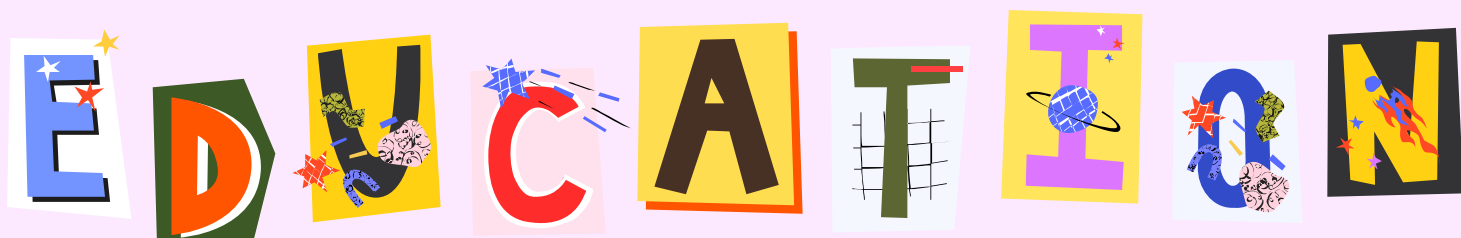

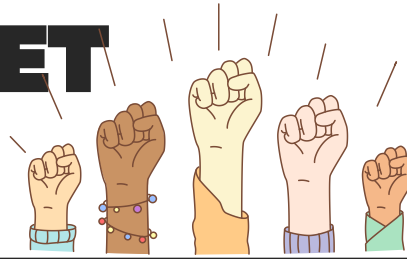


- ✓ Learn in a school, college and University that includes everyone.
- ✓ Schools must make sure you can access extra help- reasonable adjustments (Equality Act 2010).
- ✓ You and your family must be involved in decisions.
- ✓ You can get an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) if you need more help.
- ✓ Help when moving to college, training, or work.
- ✓ Protection from discrimination (Equality Act 2010).

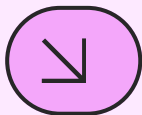
