

The Mayors West Yorkshire Local Transport Plan

October 2025

Opening

Between 29 July and 21 October 2025, the West Yorkshire Combined Authority consulted on the Local Transport Plan, receiving over 1,300 written responses and engaging a similar number of people through workshops and focus groups.

The Voice, Influence & Change Team shared the online consultation with the Leeds SEND Youth Council.

Opportunity

Lots of people agreed with the transport plan and thought it was a good idea overall. Most people liked the plans to improve how buses, trains and other travel work, and there were no big disagreements.

People said they want transport to be easy to use, safe and not too expensive. They also want better services at night and weekends, clearer information, and transport that works for everyone, including people with disabilities.

Some people were a bit worried about how the plan will work in real life, like making sure different areas are treated fairly and that big projects are affordable. They also want transport to be safe, better for the environment, and good for all communities.

Outcome

The Local Transport Plan will now guide future transport investment and projects across West Yorkshire, including major programmes like bus franchising and mass transit.

Delivery will happen through a series of Implementation Plans, with the first (covering 2026–2032) being developed in 2026 to set out specific schemes and priorities.

There will also be further engagement and consultation as individual projects are developed, alongside continued work to improve accessibility, safety, and service quality across the transport network.
